## HELP US KEEP KIDS SAFE ONLINE

In today's digital age, children are exposed to new risks. While you may have good intentions in sharing about your child, there are people who could use that information to cause harm. For your sponsored child's protection, please do not post any information online that could be used to identify or locate your child, such as last name, school name or community name. We do encourage you to post on social media to share about your experience (and hopefully inspire others to join the Save the Children family!), but to do so in a way that ensures the safety and protection of all sponsored children. **Below are a few tips on what you should and should not share online.**

### HERE'S WHAT YOU CAN SHARE

#### Child Details:

- First name
- Age and gender
- The language they speak, interests and activities
- Grade level and favorite subject

#### Country Details:

- Country name and fun facts
- Impact area and fun facts

#### Other information:

- Information about Save the Children, child sponsorship programs and how you are making a difference!

### HERE'S WHAT YOU SHOULD AVOID SHARING

#### Child Details:

- Their photo
- Last name
- Child ID (and your Donor ID)
- Birthdate
- Religion or health information
- Excerpts from letters or drawings
- The specific programs they participate in
- Personal contact information
- Family member names
- GPS coordinates of their house, school, village

#### School Details:

- Name or logo
- Location
